

ONLINE Sketching: Tips & Techniques for Beginners and Refreshers

Equipment & Materials List

- SKETCHBOOKS/PAPERS to draw on:
 - Bring along an assortment from what you have: white, different colours of toned papers, black (bright as well as subtle eg bright red/blue/yellow)
- PAPERS FOR COLLAGED BACKGROUNDS rummage around. See what you have!
 - Wrapping papers and washi tape(stripes, spotted, geometric : always good)
 - Newsprint/magazines/tickets/music/labels Cut-out text esp white on black, red

COLOURED INKS FOR PRE-PREPARED BACKGROUNDS

- Again bring what you have: a variety of colours, makes and types is best as they interact with each other.
- DeAtramentis Fog grey is a favourite for its subtle colour and circle-spreading capabilities.
- o Sennelier I love too: makes frondy edged circles, like coral.
- o Some black as well, for strength
- BACK UP BASICS (nearly all just for session 2)
 - o Table covering!
 - o Glue stick/pva
 - o scissors
 - o 3 or 4 smallish water containers
 - o a larger/taller one for washing brushes
 - o paper towels
 - o table salt or rock salt
 - o masking tape
 - o empty table area to tape papers down on



- o steel palette knife
- o stiffer brush for splattering
- o white gouache
- o cloth/sponge for brushing salt off
- BRUSHES (6 or so... your choice of sizes!)
 - o large soft brush for transferring water
 - several smaller brushes for your colours (I like dagger, sword and riggers)

DRAWING TOOLS

- Fountain pen and black ink (medium nib more versatile. Fudes wonderful for variety of line and juicy flow. Duke Confucius Fude is my all time favourite)
- NB... Plastic nibbed fude pens/sign pens are appearing more and more nowadays and I'm liking them. Various makes that draw with very fine and thick lined. I'm still trying experimenting.
- Soft pencil . My favourite is a Staedtler Mars Lumograph 8B (black body, matte)
- o Mitsubishi white Signo uniball broad
- Coloured pencils (My favourites are Holbein Artists' Pencils & Caran D'Ache watercolour pencils) Only white, cream, sky blue, pale blue and aqua & ochre
- + if you have these: not essential but good to have
 - o Peter Pauper watercolour crayons
 - o Peter Pauper Bible Highlighters (not the fluorescent set!)
- ACRYLIC MARKERS FOR TITLES, SKYLINES etc: can lift a sketch & bring unity
 - Posca bullet tip: light blue, sky blue, aqua green (my favourite!), bright red
